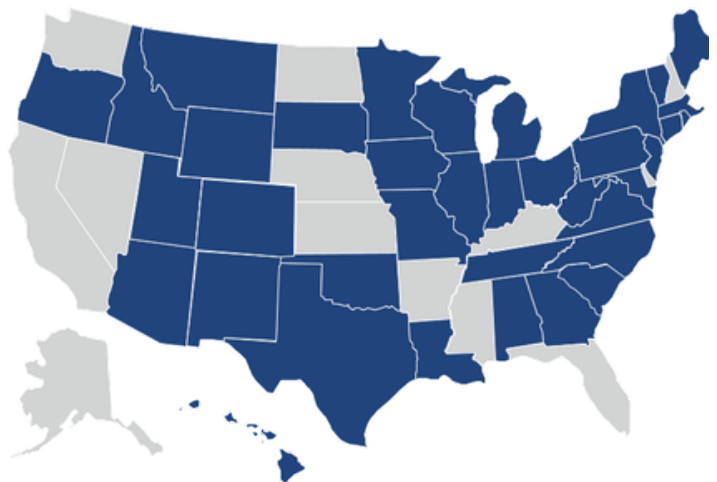


The PSEO Coalition generates, analyzes, and shares employment data that demonstrates the value of higher education. These data are publicly available through a dashboard on the U.S. Census Bureau's website.

The Longitudinal Employer-Household Dynamics (LEHD) Program, a part of the U.S. Census Bureau's Center for Economic Studies, provides public information on employers and employees. As part of that program, the Postsecondary Employment Outcomes (PSEO) data provide earnings and employment outcomes for college graduates by degree level, program of study, and institution.

The PSEO Coalition is a national network that collaborates with LEHD at the U.S. Census to link postsecondary education data with national unemployment insurance wage data, and supports its members and the larger postsecondary community in using these data. Coalition members engage virtually and in-person to network and share ideas about methods to measure and share the outcomes of postsecondary education with decision-makers of all types.

PSEO Coalition members include representatives from institutions, college and university systems, and state agencies. Members help tomorrow's employees understand what they can earn if they pursue specific degrees in various fields and equips them with tools to advocate for themselves when they enter the workforce.
